Proper representation is given to alumni and industry partners for updating the syllabi according to the social and industry needs. Teaching Learning For improving Teaching and learning experience, ICT technologies are used by the faculty members. The teachers are given training through lectures. A workshop on ICT and MOOCs and e-content development was organised for one week in March 2019. Examination and Evaluation Examination and evaluations are conducted on time in a confidential manner. External examiners and question setters are used for the examination and evaluation process. The results are declared on time and they are published online. Research and Development Research activities are encouraged by the University, as Tamil University was established as an institution of higher learning. Faculty members are encouraged to take up research projects and bring out publications. University offers grants for research activities. Faculty members are also encouraged to attend and organise seminars and workshops. In 2018-19 visiting Professors were appointed. Library ICT Tamil University has a common library and department libraries. Students are encouraged to visit library and they work on their assignments using the library resources as part of the programme in the Library. In addition to the main library the Departments also have their own library. A workshop on ICT and MOOCs and e-content development was organised for one week in March 2019. Teachers attended the workshops on MOOCs and E-content development course at HRDC Bharathidasan University HRD In this academic year 4 staff members were appointed. For the capacity building of human resource special lectures are conducted. Programmes are organised to motivate the staff members. Staff members who have contributed for more than 25 years are recognised during the Independence Day celebrations. ### 7.3 – Institutional Distinctiveness

7.3.1 – Provide the details of the performance of the institution in one area distinctive to its vision, priority and thrust in not more than 500 words

Tamil University was established for higher level research in Tamil Studies. The university, which was founded for the promotion in mother tongue, i.e. Tamil, imparts education to rural students in Tamil. Tamil University offers post graduate and research programmes. A total of 369 students enrolled in various programmes. Tamil Cultural centre was established in Tamil university. Faculty members from Tamil university visited Burma for teaching and training the teaching professionals of the Tamil diaspora. Tamil Development centre for Tamil language development across the world has also been established. Tamil University was part of the Tamil terms and terminologies compilation project (Sorkuvai). International workshop on Tamil epigraphy was organised. A training programme was organised on Marathi language. In 2018-19 several public lectures and seminars were arranged many students and interested individuals participated in these activities and benefited. The staff members published 176 books and book chapters this year. They published 205 papers in journals. The teaching members carried out several research projects on various themes and archaeological excavation was conducted at Nangur village in Nagapattinam district.

### 8.Future Plans of Actions for Next Academic Year

Tamil University plans to revise the Ph.D. regulations and conduct Common Entrance Test for Ph.D. admissions from the next academic year. Tamil University offers academic programmes only at P.G. level and the university seeks to introduce Integrated Programmes in the next academic year, so that the University can extend its activity of imparting education to the graduate level students. The University has many departments and the services of all the teachers may be used for these new academic programmes. The Yoga Centre would be developed and all the teachers were also encouraged to undertake research projects. Tamil Development Centre and Tamil Cultural Centres would be further expanded to reach out to Tamil Diaspora. The University also plans to develop the academic infrastructure using the RUSA funds. New construction of first floor is planned in the Science Faculty, and Yoga Centre will be constructed. In addition the Indoor Auditorium and Outdoor Auditorium for Sports will be constructed. Research equipment would be purchased for various departments to augment research activities.
